

Community Fibre Partnership Grant Scheme

BT has made £2m available via a grant for Community Fibre Partnerships that could benefit your local school. Communities in the final 5% of the UK not covered by fibre broadband rollout plans can apply for a grant of up to £20,000 towards the cost of their new fibre infrastructure, if it could also serve their local school. For example, if the cost for a gap-funded solution that serves a school has been quoted as £23,000, the community would pay £11,500 and £11,500 would be match-funded by the grant.
